

★ Topeka DREAMS Neighborhood Improvement Initiatives Program (NIIP)

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Topeka DREAMS Neighborhood Improvement Initiatives Program (NIIP) is a collaborative effort between the City of Topeka and Neighborhood Improvement Associations (NIAs) aimed at enhancing neighborhoods through infrastructure, housing improvements, and community development. The program operates through three initiative levels:

DREAMS 1 – INTENSIVE INVESTMENT EVERY TWO YEARS

- Target: One active NIA per cycle. (Intensive Care or At-risk with block group of 2.0 health score)
 Funding:
 - Up to \$1.4 million for infrastructure improvements.
 - Up to \$150,000 for utilities infrastructure.
 - Up to \$330,000 for housing rehabilitation and affordable housing investments.
- * **Process:** Development of a Comprehensive Neighborhood Plan in partnership with the City.

DREAMS 2 – MAJOR PROJECTS EVERY TWO YEARS

- Funding: Up to \$1.4 million per neighborhood for infrastructure improvements. Up to \$150,000 for utilities infrastructure.
- Housing Funds: Up to \$330,000 in HUD housing funds for eligible low- and moderate-income neighborhoods. (Up to four neighborhood areas)
- Eligibility: Projects must align with neighborhood goals and address current conditions.

DREAMS 3 – MINI-GRANT PROJECTS ANNUALLY

- Funding: Grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$50,000, totaling \$200,000 annually.
- Purpose: Small infrastructure improvements, neighborhood beautification, and community building.
- Eligibility: Projects must be located within predominantly low/moderate-income neighborhoods.

2026 APPLICATION YEAR – FOCUS ON DREAMS 3

- Consult Meetings: April May 2025
- Housing Rehab Program Discussion: June 4, 2025
- Application Workshop: June 11, 2025
- Preliminary Applications Due: July 1, 2025
- Final Applications Due: August 22, 2025

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DREAMS 3 – ELIGIBLE PROJECTS LIST

PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

- Sidewalks & ADA Ramps (no brick)*
- Curb repair/replacement (no brick or stone resetting)
- Alley approaches
- Pedestrian signals and Crosswalks*
- Traffic Calming/Safety Measures
- Tree Planting
- Lighting/Solar Lighting (Right-of-Way only / no midblock lighting in residential areas)
- *Accessibility

PUBLIC UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

- Paint Storm Structure Lids, Hydrants (painting/cleaning)
- Install Driveway Culverts & Drainage Ditch Maintenance
- Small Stormwater Development Control Plan (DCP) or Best Management Practice (BMP) Initiatives for controlling flooding, reducing erosion
- Replace Fire Hydrants

NEIGHBORHOOD BEAUTIFICATION & QUALITY OF LIFE PROJECTS

- Public Park Amenities /Playgrounds*
- Public Community/Recreation/School structures/grounds improvements*
- Public Bus Shelters/Benches*
- Murals/Banners/Place making monuments OR signs
- *Accessibility .

COMMUNITY BUILDING & ENGAGEMENT PROJECTS

- Public Programs Community Education classes/programs (various topics)
- Public Events ex. Neighborhood Block Parties/Festivals/Holiday Happenings, Neighborhood Resource or Health Fair, Community or Family Event Partnerships (Schools, Churches, other local entity)
- Sports Tournaments/Training Events
- Talent Shows/Concerts
- Game Nights/Tournaments
- Neighborhood Clean-up
- Financial Literacy / Homeownership / Repair classes

BASIC REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PROJECTS:

• Projects must be located within the officially recognized boundaries of the applying NIA, as approved by the City of Topeka.

• The project scope and budget must include all costs related to required permits, design, construction, installation, and any applicable local, state, or federal fees.

• For projects not located on City-owned property or within the public right-of-way, written approvals and/or signed petitions are required from the appropriate property owners or authorities (e.g., City, County, State, Federal). Please refer to the **Staff Consult Recommendations** for project-specific approval requirements.
